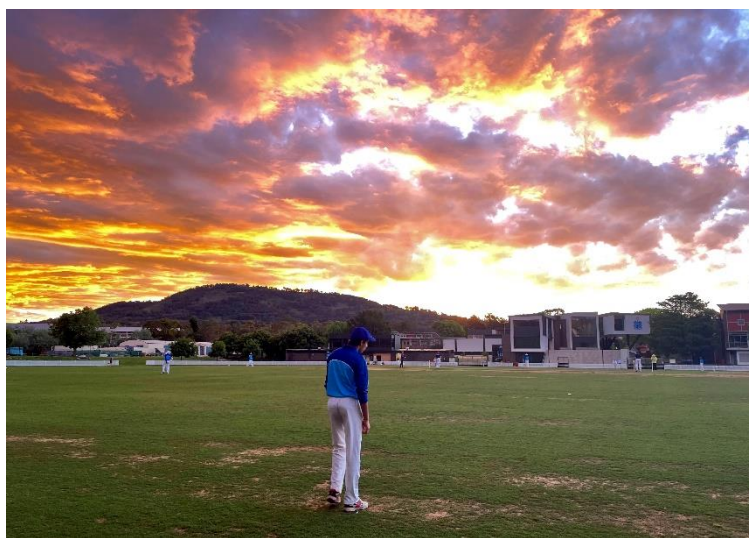

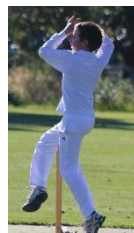
**TEAM PERFORMANCE:** 3 wins; 4 Losses; 5 Draws.
