### *President's Report*

Season 2025–26 was a year that reminded us why Marist cricket is such a special community. It was a season defined not only by trophies and statistics, but by resilience, sportsmanship and generosity.

Our players delivered performances to be proud of across every age group. Stage 3 Div 2 Light brought home the One Day trophy and our boys had premiership glory in Colts, Stage 3 and Stage 2 T20 competitions. Ten more teams reached runner-up or semi-final positions, meaning Marist featured in finals at every junior stage. These collective efforts secured the Junior Club Championship for the second consecutive year, with more than 50,000 runs scored across the club—an extraordinary achievement.

Individual honours were equally impressive.

Amongst hundreds of terrific individual performances, Luca Ciocca-Marchant, Edwin Tijo and Tom Smith bagged Hat Tricks in First XI. James Rae did the same in Stage 1. Harmehar Cheema and Noah Batch scored centuries in Colts and Nick Brennan got two in stage 3. Congratulations to Tom Smith, ACT Senior Cricketer of the Year and Lindwall Medallist, whose leadership and composure were invaluable. Congratulations also to Nate Hamilton, ACT Spirit of Cricket Award recipient, recognised for being “diligent, proactive, respectful and conscientious” in both coaching and playing roles.

Kalindu Karunaratne, Charlie Foley, Kaveer Rohatgi were named Stage Cricketers of the Year for their outstanding efforts. Lachlan Field and Vivan Veer Passi were recognised as stars of the future with the Emerging Batting Award and Emerging Bowler Award respectively.

A special milestone was reached by Xander Denny, who joined the elite “Triple Club” with over 1000 runs, 100 wickets and 50 catches/stumpings.

Xander and Tom Smith now share the club record for most career wickets on 174.

A number of Marist players earned representative selection, including Aby Tharmarajah (ACT U17), Luca Ciocca-Marchant (ACT U16), and Luc Tipping (Australian Schools U15).

The season was filled with unforgettable moments—nail-biting finishes, last-ball victories, hat-tricks, centuries, and new entries into the record books. Few stories capture the heart of Marist cricket better than Colts Navy taking three wickets in the final over to make the semis, or Stage 3 Light winning their semi-final on the last ball before claiming the premiership the following week.

Just as important as on-field success was the character shown by our boys. Across the club, players were praised for enthusiasm at training... being polite and respectful... focussing on their

contribution to the team. Their willingness to fill in for other teams, support younger grades, and coach junior sides reflects the values we hold dear. Players like William Holl and Saxon-Owens McVie, among many, earned praise for putting their hand up at every opportunity to help other teams short on players. This season, 18 senior boys coached junior teams—a contribution that strengthens our club’s future.

Our volunteers once again formed the backbone of the season. With 32 teams and 89 team volunteers, the commitment from coaches, managers, coordinators, and parents was extraordinary. Your efforts ensured every boy had a positive, well-supported cricket experience. The introduction of our new Coaches Award highlighted the quality of leadership across the club, with nine nominations and Will Denny recognised for his outstanding impact.

I also extend heartfelt thanks to our committee, including new members who made immediate and meaningful contributions. Special congratulations to Chris Duffy and Phil Marchant, recipients of the President’s Award for their tireless work. Our school partners—teachers, sports administrators, and grounds staff—continued to champion our program and provide exceptional facilities.

To the senior boys concluding their Marist cricket journeys (Tom Smith, Plugga Hyson, Liam Denny, Noah Brown, Dom Honan, Jack Austin, Charlie Berry, Jackson Hillsdon, Viira Peris, Aby Tharmarajah, Finn McGuire, Jared Wilson, Tom Jexin and Ethan Golder) we wish you well we hope cricket remains a source of enjoyment and friendship in the years ahead.

Finally, thank you to our sponsors (Greg Chappell Cricket, Queanbeyan Podiatry and the Canberra Southern Cross Club) and community partners, whose generosity strengthens our programs and supports our charitable efforts towards the McGrath Foundation, and Team Sports For All. ## *Stage 2 Div 1 Royal One Day Runners-up*

**TEAM PERFORMANCE:** 15 Wins; 5 Losses

Stage 2 Royal enjoyed a terrific season filled with strong performances, exciting games and plenty of improvement along the way. The team started the season in outstanding form, winning their first four matches while batting first and posting some impressive totals.



Like any good season, there were a few lessons along the way. A batting collapse against Radford showed the boys the importance of digging in during difficult periods, and it was pleasing to see them apply that lesson in later matches, with only one score below 150 for the remainder of the season (unless chasing fewer runs). A narrow T20 loss, where dropped catches at key moments proved costly, also provided valuable motivation. The boys worked hard on their fielding at training, and it showed in matches: regulation chances were taken consistently, and there were also a few catches that would have made the highlights reel at international level.

At the halfway point of the season we were sitting high on the ladder with nine wins and two losses. However, we narrowly lost the first two one-day games after Christmas, meaning we needed to win our final three matches to qualify for finals. The boys responded brilliantly, starting with an incredible comeback win over YDCC Mavericks (who had been undefeated since Round 1), before completing our highest run chase of the season in the final round.

A clinical performance in the field against CGS in the semi-final — with very few loose deliveries and several excellent catches taken — had the boys full of confidence heading into the grand final. While they couldn't quite repeat the heroics, they can hold their heads high after a stellar season in which every player learned to play their role, developed strategy and game awareness, and made important contributions with bat, ball, and in the field.

### THE PLAYERS

<b>Hunter Black</b>	Hunter's elegant batting style was a pleasure to watch, highlighted by a composed 35 in the final round that helped set up our biggest run chase of the season. With the ball he regularly threatened the stumps, hitting the top of off to win the game against CGS Navy and taking two key wickets in the semi-final to turn the match. A reliable presence in the field, Hunter also took several excellent catches.
<b>Jobe Chisholm</b>	Jobe was one of the team's most consistent bowlers, able to deliver with either pace or spin and regularly hitting the right areas. In a must-win game against Mavericks he broke a dangerous partnership with two quick wickets to swing the match our way. With the bat he could play inventive shots like ramps and reverse sweeps, but his greatest value came through calm, steady innings under pressure, including a crucial 42-run last-wicket partnership in the semi-final to get us to a competitive total.
<b>Harvey Fillbrook</b>	Harvey regularly took the new ball and had a knack for striking early, including once taking a wicket with his first two deliveries. His batting developed as the season progressed, and he produced some important contributions through his clean striking of the ball, highlighted by a beautifully timed straight six. He was a solid performer in the grand final, picking up two wickets and a great catch to give us a chance.

<b>Charlie Foley</b>	<p>Chip could strike the ball with effortless power, and his batting went to another level in the second half of the season. His unbeaten 59 in the semi-final was a match-defining innings that lifted the team to a competitive total. With the ball his left-arm spin became increasingly effective as the season progressed, culminating in a superb 5/13 against Norths that completely turned the game, while he also proved a reliable fielder who looked comfortable behind the stumps when needed.</p>
<b>William Holl</b>	<p>Will was one of the team's opening bowlers and our leading wicket-taker, building pressure through a consistent line and length, including remarkable figures of 4/5 against Queanbeyan. Batting in the middle-to-lower order, he often produced important runs when the team needed them most, highlighted by a vital 51 against CGS Navy. Always dependable in the field, Will also stepped up as a leader and captained the side during the finals.</p>
<b>Edward Miller</b>	<p>Ned joined the team midway through the season after impressing with a half-century against us earlier in the year. He would use the pace of the ball to find the boundary with ease, striking at over 150 for the season. His 49 not out (off 30 balls) in the grand final took us to a good score after runs had been hard to come by early. Behind the stumps he was outstanding — rarely conceding byes, confidently standing up to the fast bowlers, and producing a brilliant stumping in the semi-final.</p>
<b>Angad Singh</b>	<p>Angad was the quickest bowler in the team and finished the season with the best bowling average. He could swing games our way quickly, claiming three wickets on two occasions and producing an unplayable yorker to dismiss Wests' set batter when they looked likely to win. With the bat he was equally dangerous, regularly launching powerful shots to and over the rope, including a crucial 58 against YDCC Mavericks to set up a competitive total and 49 vs Norths to set up our biggest run chase.</p>
